Please be able to furnish work(s) for intake by July 2011 at the latest—earlier is preferable, if possible.

To that end, if you would like assistance in choosing work(s) to donate, we would be happy to help. Please contact us and let us know, and we will schedule a studio visit with you to determine what work(s) would be most viable for the auction.

You acknowledge that the Work will be displayed for public viewing as well as put up for sale at auction, and that upon donation, the Donator forfeits all ownership and control over the Work to the New York Psychoanalytic Society. The New York Psychoanalytic Society may also make reproductions of the Work both for use in a publicity context as well as to sell to the public.

The New York Psychoanalytic Society will exercise the utmost care in respect to handling the Work and its safekeeping, as it does in safeguarding its own property of the same or similar nature. However, the New York Psychoanalytic Society assumes no guarantee of protection for any Works held in its possession following the donation.

The loan of this Work constitutes a donation to the New York Psychoanalytic Society, who will use the profits generated from its sale to benefit the New York Psychoanalytic Society.
